Last March, in response to guidance from state and local health authorities, we as a congregation moved worship from our sanctuary to a virtual experience recorded and made available by video. Although it is not clear what worship will look like in the future, we long for the day we can return to worshipping in person in the sanctuary.

In addition to the worship video recorded on Wednesday evening and made available on Sunday morning, we have treasured opportunities about once a month to be together as a congregation synchronously, typically by Zoom. These have included Theda's farewell, congregational meetings, All Saints observance, Christmas Eve service, and the recent outdoor prayer event on Church Street. The intention is to continue making this effort once a month.

Bringing these together -- worship and a synchronous gathering of the entire congregation -- a special experience of worship is being planned. On **Wednesday, Feb. 3 at 7 p.m.**, the congregation is invited to Zoom the recording of the video service for Feb. 7. This is meant to provide an opportunity to worship together synchronously and to give an insider's view of what happens at the recording session each Wednesday evening.

In addition, there will be a brief opportunity following the service to both reflect with others on our experience and to dream together about what worship may be like when we are able to return to in-person worship.
