Oct. 25 Ariana Goings Mary Ramseyer All Saints Day is one of the oldest feast days of the Christian Church Year. This festival day reminds us, not only of the "cloud of witnesses" named in Hebrews 11, but also of all the people of God, living and dead, who together form the body of Christ. This year we will observe All Saints Day in the worship service on Sunday, Nov. 1. The service offers a time of recognizing and remembering both those connected to our faith community who died in the year since the last All Saints service and those who have experienced personal loss of loved ones during the past year. So, the service is an opportunity to be present to the loss we have experienced individually and collectively in moving toward healing.

Because we continue to worship virtually, this offers some unique challenges and opportunities. Those lighting candles and remembering people will gather at two different times. Those who are remembering loved ones connected to First Mennonite Church will gather and record from 6:30-6:45 p.m. on Wednesday, Oct. 28 in the sanctuary. Then, from 6:45-7:15 the same evening, any persons who have experienced personal loss are invited to gather, name their loved one and their relationship, light a candle and give thanks.

We want to do this in a way that is as safe as possible. We ask that everyone participating wear masks during the service. There is hand sanitizer at each building entrance and at the entrances to the sanctuary. Please use it when entering and exiting. Please sit around the sanctuary at least six feet from others.
