Tickets are still available for the Bluffton University Artist Series performance by Apollo's Fire, a baroque chamber ensemble, at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 24, in Yoder Recital Hall. Tickets are \$25 for adults, \$20 for senior citizens and non-Bluffton students and \$10 for children ages 6-13. Children ages 5 and under are admitted free. On August 11, 2014, the Detroit metro area experienced record breaking rainfall causing homes and roadways to become overwhelmed with flood waters. In addition, more than 129,000 home owners with flooded basements from backup registered with FEMA for assistance. The flood was the largest FEMA declared disaster in 2014, yet it has been largely forgotten - except by those still dealing with its aftermath.

- (Phase 1) MDS's Region II opened a response in Detroit in November 2014, and through February worked with All Hands Volunteers in cleaning out over 200 basements.
- (Phase 2) Region II reopened the project in May and to date we have cleaned out more than 35 basements, with many more scheduled. Phase 2 will continue through October 9.
- (Phase 3) MDS will open a traditional response with long-term volunteers (i.e., project director, office manager, cook, crew leaders, etc.) and weekly volunteers needed. Phase 3 begins on October 18 and will include continuation of cleaning basements but also rebuilding in some basements and related projects. Lawrence Matthews will continue to serve as Project Coordinator during Phase 3.
