You may have noticed "Pastoral Prayer" is out and "Community Prayer" is in. As Mennonites we believe in the priesthood of all believers. Simply said, we believe that everyone has access to God and we all bear the responsibility to use our gifts in the context of the church and community. Here at First Mennonite Church we have identified "Gifts Expression" as one of our five priorities.

Gifts Expression: We have a deep desire to engage the gifts we hold in service to God and others, in congregational life and in the world. We believe this is in line with our priorities of expressing the gifts of the congregation. Please note that we continue the practice of only publicly naming prayers of folks who have given us specific permission to name their concern.
