

Next Sunday during worship we will receive communion together, an act of faith and love. The service is a communion of the reality that in Christ we are made one body and together we make him present in the world. Electronic Giving is a new option for giving in support of First Mennonite Church. The process is now ready for those who want to sign up for this new option. On the FMC website a link titled "ONLINE GIVING" is located at the far right of the red navigation bar. To sign up, a person will need their bank routing number and their checking account number, found on the bottom of any check on their account. A starting date will be requested, as will frequency (weekly, monthly, and quarterly). Our FMC "beta testers" have found the process to be quick and easy. Bill Suter will be pleased to answer any questions at 419-235-0584. The "E-Giving" option was developed due to requests to the Stewardship Commission. All forms of donations are still appreciated, whether by cash, check or E-Giving.

A peace pole has been ordered from *Peace Pole Makers*, Maple City, MI. It is a six-sided pole constructed of cedar and painted white. Each side of the pole has the phrase "May Peace Prevail on Earth" printed in one of six languages: English, Spanish, French, Japanese, Swahili, and Pennsylvania Dutch, which was the language that Pastor Steve Yoder grew up speaking. The pole will be placed about halfway between the Jackson Street entrance and the corner of the church at Jackson and Church Streets. There will be a small walk-way of pavers from the sidewalk to the peace pole, with landscaping around the base of the pole. The pole will have a small brass plate saying that it is dedicated to Pastor Steve Yoder. The peace pole dedication will be held during worship on June 18. *The Peace Pole Committee includes John Rich, Carolyn Rich, Ruth Early, Chad Paul, and Janet Yoder.*

"Connecting" is one of the five priorities determined during our Congregational Discernment process. We extend our hospitality to our guests by placing **Guest Books** at the three main entrances into the sanctuary. We ask that visitors sign one of the guest books and include a mailing address or e-mail address. This enables me to follow up with a note. FMC regular attenders are asked to welcome guests and encourage them to sign a guest book. To simplify this process – and to focus more on welcoming guests – we have removed the Friendship Pads from pews in the sanctuary.
