The "Mirror of the Martyrs" traveling exhibit continues in the Albrecht Gallery of Sauder Visual Arts Center at Bluffton University. Gallery hours are Monday-Friday, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.; Saturday, 1-5 p.m. and Sunday, 1-6 p.m.

- "The Ephrata 'Martyrs Mirror: A History Dramatic and Useful,'" curated by Carrie Phillips, archives and special collections librarian at Bluffton University, is now open. The Musselman Library's Mennonite Historical Collection contains many copies of the 1748 "Martyrs Mirror." This exhibit explores the craft of early colonial printing as displayed in the Ephrata Cloister's publication of the "Martyrs Mirror" and other German devotional materials. The library's exhibit will be open through November 5 from 2-5 p.m., M, W, F and 3-6 p.m., Sunday.
- The Swiss Community Historical Society sponsors the Great Day of Singing at 4 p.m. today in Yoder Recital Hall. Bradley Kauffman, project director of the new
