Bluffton area pastors introduce “Ashes to Go”

On the morning of Ash Wednesday, March 6, a group of Bluffton area pastors will be offering “Ashes to Go,” a new approach to a centuries-old Christian tradition. Ashes to Go is offered because reminders of need, humility and healing shouldn’t be confined to church buildings. The ashes remind us of our need for God, and of God’s call to us. There is much more to the beginning of Lent than ashes alone, and people are still encouraged to make time for worship with a community of faith. A handout with an explanation and information on local Ash Wednesday services will be given to those who participate. Ashes to Go will be offered from 7-9 a.m. at the corner of Main and Cherry Streets. Pedestrians, drivers and passengers of vehicles who pull over are invited to participate.
