MCC creating immigration detainee care kits

When people who have been placed in immigration detention centers are released, they often have little more than the clothes they're wearing. Kits containing clothing and hygiene products can help to rebuild their dignity as they transition into life outside the detention center.

MCC is partnering with the South Texas Response Team, a group of pastors working with Catholic Charities Respite Center in McAllen, Good Neighbor Settlement House in Brownsville, Loaves and Fishes in Harlingen, Angry Tias & Abuelas in the Rio Grande Valley, and other partners to distribute kits to people as they leave detention and are taken to bus stations or airports to reconnect with their families.
